The Need

Employment is a central part of adult life, but for adults with developmental disabilities, significant barriers prevent the majority from finding full-time employment. Volunteering, however, is an excellent alternative, and provides a means for them to contribute to the community, achieve a sense of purpose, and acquire new skills.

Our Mission

To provide a connecting platform by which Very Special Volunteers (VSV) who donate their time and abilities to local nonprofits can generate funds to aid in the support of the Covenant Ability Network of Michigan (CAN of MI) homes where they reside. This provides self-worth to the Very Special Volunteer, much-needed funds for CAN of MI, and the satisfaction of making a positive impact for the donor. Truly a win-win for all.

How it Works

Donors support the volunteer service of a CAN of MI resident(s), contributing a set dollar amount of their choosing, per volunteer hour. Donations are made out to "CAN of MI" and are tax deductible. Donors have the option to designate a maximum annual donation amount. All contributions directly support the CAN of MI group homes where the resident(s) lives.



For example, if Beth volunteers a total of 500 hours this year, and a donor pledged to support \$2 for every hour she volunteers, it will generate a \$1,000 tax deductible donation that benefits the CAN of MI group homes, including the one where Beth lives.
